Current status

- The Wyee Paper Subdivision Reference Group was established in November, consisting of six landowners, three council staff and three Lake Macquarie Councillors.
- The group have met twice already, and have spent the time getting to know each other, talk about the role and purpose of the group and have begun to look at the paper subdivision legislation. - Council has also commenced preparing briefs and seeking quotes for planning investigations to help with the development

plan for the paper subdivision.

Next steps

- In early 2018, the reference group will investigate funding options for landowners as well as consider other aspects of the development plan. Council will also be engaging consultants and contractors to carry out investigations into flora and fauna, archaeology, geotechnical conditions and land surveying.
- We plan to hold face-to-face consultation with all landowners in mid-2018 to provide an update of progress on the Development Plan and seek your feedback.
